


1.1 Installing the battery in the telephone

Installing the battery in the telephone



Before inserting the battery module into the phone, make sure that its lock is in the unlocked position



While maintaining the battery module in position, slip the lock to the locked position



Check that the battery module is properly installed in its housing


To remove it



Slip the lock to the unlocked position



Lift the battery module from the bottom



You can then remove the battery module

1.2 Charging your telephone battery



It is important to fully charge your phone before using it for the first time.



Connect the charger and place the telephone in the charging holder;. The battery charger LED lights. The battery LED is in charging mode on the phone screen.

If the battery is completly discharged, a charging time of several minutes is required before the set will light up again.



A charging location in the back of the charger is dedicated for loading an extra battery:

- Open the protection cover in the back of the charger
- Place the battery in the dedicated location
- A LED indicates that the battery is properly installed and is charging

=	Battery fully charged (75% - 100%)
=	Battery half charged (33% - 75%)
□	Low battery (0% - 33%)
•	Battery completely discharged (0%)
=	Battery charge icon is animated when the phone is on the charger



Recharge your telephone battery regularly. The telephone can be on or off when recharging the battery. If the telephone is to remain unused or out of its charger for several weeks, remove the battery and store it separately.



The battery of the phone or the spare battery pack is fully charged when the chargers led (white) lights off.

1.3 Switching on your telephone



Press the switch on/off key (long press). Wait a few seconds (about 3s). Your telephone is switched on



Press on the same key (long press) to switch off the handset.

1.4 Install a bluetooth device (pairing)




Before using a Bluetooth device with your phone, you must install the Bluetooth module in your phone.

For more information, contact your installer or administrator.





1.5 Installing the memory card



You must be in possession of the memory card for your phone





Slide in the memory card from under the two small crescents and press it as shown in figure Installing the battery in the telephone Turn on the handset



When an empty memory card is inserted, the configuration of the handset is copied to the memory card. Note that the DECT subscriptions of the handset are also moved to the memorycard. Therefore, when you remove the memory card from the handset you won't be able to make or receive calls with your handset



Dropping the handset may cause the memory card to dislodge inside the handset. When this happens, the user will be warned via an audible warning signal every 5 seconds, and the message 'Check memory card' is given. Please insert the memory card correctly in the handset.



2.6 Programming your personal directory



Without a memory card, your personal directory can contain up to 20 contacts (200 with a memory card). A contact can contain up to 4 numbers.

To key in the name: the keys in the keypad include letters that you can display by pressing them successively.

Example: press '8' twice to display the letter 'U'.

When entering text, you can switch to the upper case mode, lower case and the numeric keypad by pressing successively on the # key.

2.7 Speed dial



This feature allows you to associate a contact to a key on the keypad. Therefore, pressing and holding on this key will automatically start the call to the associated contact. This feature allows to associate a contact or a feature code to a key on the kepypad. Pressing and holdingon this key will automatically start the call to the contact or will activate the associated feature



2.10 Activate / Deactivate voice frequency

During a conversation you sometimes have to send DTMF signals, such as with a voice server, an automated attendant or a remotely consulted answering machine.

Press the star key (hold down for a few seconds).



The function is automatically cancelled when you hang up.



Depending on the system's configuration, the voice frequency can be activated by default. For more information, contact your installer or administrator.

3.1 Introduction

Your system offers a wide range of services and features. To activate a feature while in communication, enter the feature code directly. For information on the features codes list, contact your installer or administrator. The operation of your phone depends on its single-line or multiline installation. By default, your set is installed as a single-line set. For more information regarding this configuration, contact the person in charge of your installation.

3.3 Mute, so that your correspondent cannot hear you

3.4 Putting a caller on hold

During a conversation, you wish to place the call on hold and recover it later, on the same telephone.



3.8 Transferring a call (single-line terminal only)

After dialling the destination number, you can transfer the call directly without waiting for your correspondent's reply by validating the 'Transfer' option. You can initiate the transfer by using the icon or the 'Transfer' text. The transfer between two external correspondents and the transfer by pressing the hang-up key depend on the system configuration.







6.1 Subscribing the handset to a DECT system

You must subscribe the handset to at least one DECT system before you can use the handset to make a call.



The handset can operate with a maximum of four DECT systems

When the handset is not yet subscribed to a system, the following message appears on the display screen: Register.

Before you subscribe to a DECT system, obtain the following information from your system administrator: PARK code: Use a PARK code system ID only if more than one DECT system overlaps in your location. DECT system name: The name of the system to which you subscribe. After you enter the system name, it appears on the idle display.



8.1 Characteristics of the mains power adapter

■ Entry: 100/240 V - 50/60 Hz ■ Exit: 12 V DC - 500 mA



The mains power socket used must be close to the charger/holder and easily accessible, so that it can be used as an 'on/off' facility.

8.2 Headphone / external microphone

The side of the telephone features a headphone / external microphone socket. Contact your retailer for information on the various headphone models.

Your headset must be 2.5mm jack type.

Make sure to deactivate the Bluetooth feature if it is activated.

8.3 Cleaning your telephone

Your telephone does not require any particular servicing. However, it may be cleaned using a soft, damp cloth.



Do not use soap or detergent that would risk altering the colours or damaging the surface of the telephone.

8.4 Transporting and protecting your telephone

To avoid losing your telephone, get into the habit of clipping it onto your belt. Your telephone can also be carried in a protective case.



Various models of carrying case are available. Ask your installation technician for information. It is vital to use the special protective carrying case if your telephone is to be used in an industrial environment (presence of dust, filings, vapours of diverse origins and risk of being dropped). If the telephone is used with a carrying case, the belt clip must be removed.

Precautions for use / Declaration of compliance

Safety Instructions

- Changes or modifications to the equipment not expressly approved by the party responsible for compliance could void the users authority to operate the equipment.
- To limit the risk of interference, people with pacemakers must keep the wireless telephone away from their equipment (minimum distance of 15 cm).
- It is recommend to follow the standard acceptance procedures before using this equipment in human safety critical areas (hospitals...).
- DECT equipment can only be used to establish links between fixed points if these links are temporary and the equivalent isotropically radiated power at the antenna is less than 250 mW.
